

JVI by the Numbers: 2010 in Review

The mission of Justice Ventures International (“JVI”) is to secure freedom, justice and restoration for the poor and oppressed around the world. Towards this end JVI has accomplished the following in 2010:

2453 The total number of lives directly impacted by the work of JVI in securing freedom, justice and restoration for the poor and oppressed.

1295 victims of human trafficking received legal services provided by JVI.

285 legal cases were handled for victims of injustice by JVI lawyers (*including cases focusing on debt slavery, sex trafficking, wrongful imprisonment, religious persecution, and other injustices*).

274 human trafficking victims were rescued.

100 or more local and international volunteers and consultants promoted justice by participating in JVI projects in the US, India and China.

45 trainings conducted for justice venture partners and hundreds of individuals by JVI (*on eradicating human trafficking, empowering families in slums, and ensuring justice for other vulnerable groups*).

44 perpetrators of human trafficking crimes and caste or religious-based crimes against the poor were convicted.

44 justice programs and professional service matters handled by JVI on behalf of justice venture partners.

31 justice venture partners strengthened by JVI in 2010 (*by equipping justice ventures through legal and other support, providing capital, and multiplying impact through volunteers*).

29 men at risk of wrongful imprisonment were released from jail.
